

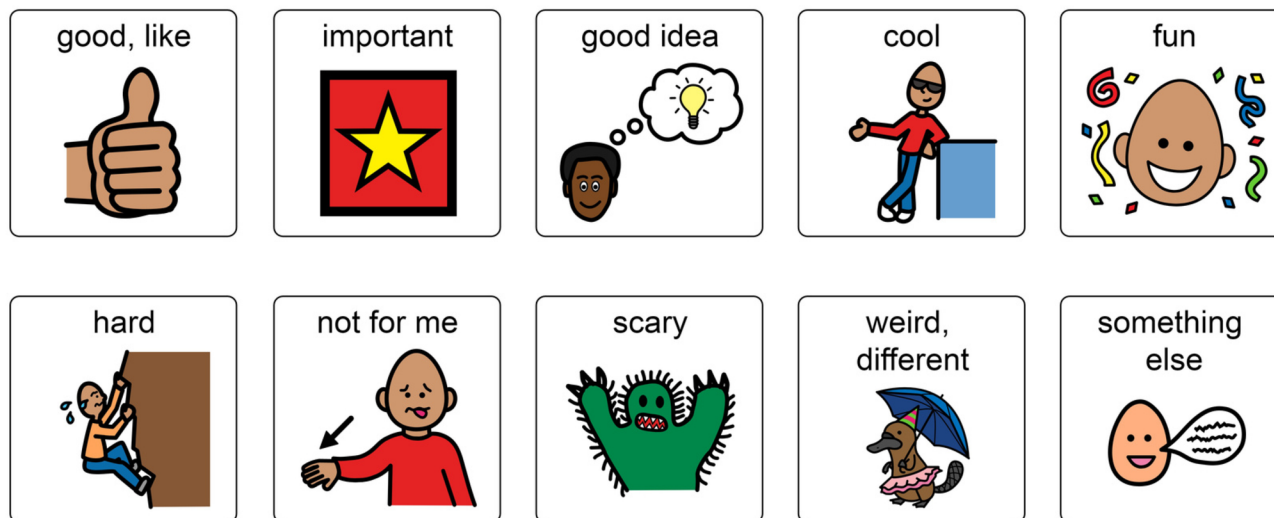
Let's talk about mentoring

How to use this board

This board was designed to encourage conversations about mentoring.

You can use it to talk to a person to add visual information, or to provide them with vocabulary specific to mentoring that they can use alone or combine with their robust AAC system.

If the person is not able to point to the symbols, then use the board in a way that works for them or in combination with their own authentic communication methods.

Here are some suggested messages you could model using the vocabulary on the board.

Statements

I have a mentor/mentee.

I have a question about ____.

My mentor is someone like (same) me/you.

I think it's - (turn over for opinion words).

I want to talk about the future.

Mentors and mentees have things in common.

Let's keep in touch.

I don't know.

Tell me more.

Questions

Do you have one? (I have a question you have mentor?)

Who is your mentor?

How do I get (have) a mentor? (how I have mentor).

What happens? (What mentor tell me more).

What do you think?
